

**WORKSHOP MINUTES
SEMINOLE CITY COUNCIL
March 28, 2017**

The Workshop of the Seminole City Council was held on Tuesday, March 28, 2017, in City Hall, City Council Chambers, 9199 - 113th Street North, Seminole, Florida.

Mayor Waters called the meeting to order at 8:29 p.m.

Present were: Mayor Leslie Waters, Vice-Mayor Chris Burke, Councilor Thom Barnhorn, Councilor Roger Edelman, Councilor Bob Matthews, Councilor Jim Quinn, Councilor Trish Springer, City Manager Ann Toney-Deal, City Attorney Jay Daigneault, City Clerk Patty Beliveau and Finance Director Harry Kyne.

1. PENNY FOR PINELLAS

Mayor Waters recognized City Manager Toney-Deal to explain. City Manager Toney-Deal reviewed the city projects that have utilized past and current “Penny for Pinellas” (Penny) funding, such as Public Works Garage and Office, Community Center, Road Resurfacing and Drainage, Parks and Recreation projects.

City Manager Toney-Deal identified the City Council Goals that would be eligible for the Penny funding: Redevelopment of Blossom Lake Park, road and resurfacing projects, purchase of the Repetto property, redesigning the 113th Street entrance to the Recreation Building, City Hall sign masonry and/or digital sign, Waterfront Park construction and the design and reconstruction of Johnson Boulevard.

The County estimates that the City will receive \$23,184,000 from the Penny IV for Fiscal Year 2020 through Fiscal Year 2030 should said referendum pass.

Council consensus was to consider funding the following projects from the Penny IV monies:


- ❖ Redevelopment of Blossom Lake Park
- ❖ Road and Resurfacing projects/drainage/pre-treatment
- ❖ Purchase of Repetto property
- ❖ Construction of Waterfront Park
- ❖ Johnson Boulevard corridor safety improvements
- ❖ New Recreation Center Building
- ❖ Seminole Boulevard/Park Boulevard/70th Avenue Corridor Improvement


Council consensus to remove “City Hall sign masonry and/or digital sign” and “Redesign of 113th Street entrance to Recreation Building” from the list.
