The Business Meeting of the Seminole City Council was held on Tuesday, December 17, 2024, at 6:00 p.m., in City Hall, City Council Chambers, 9199 - 113th Street North, Seminole, Florida.

City Manager Toney-Deal stated that the new radios will replace Fire Rescue Department radios that have been in use for ten (10) years. The cost will be a 71%/29% split with Pinellas County. Staff recommended approval of this purchase and to piggyback with the State of Washington Purchase Contract.
