



## **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has provided scholarships to high school students to improve civics literacy in Florida; and

WHEREAS, the University of South Florida St. Petersburg and the YMCA are partnering to create a new Civics Fellows Program; and

WHEREAS, the Civics Fellows Program will help to deepen understanding of government at the local and state levels; and

WHEREAS, the Civics Fellows Program will teach the importance and impact of local and state government on society; and

WHEREAS, there will be a focus on improving civic engagement for future generations of leaders; and

WHEREAS, the Civics Fellows Program will increase rates of millennials participating in important society institutions including volunteering, voting and school events; and

WHEREAS, the Civics Fellows Program will provide hands-on experiences in government and public service; and

WHEREAS, the USFSP and the YMCA will provide a university experience to high school students through a summer institute program, whereby participants earn up to six college credits in politics and leadership; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Judithanne Scourfield McLauchlan, USFSP Political Science Professor and Coordinator of the USFSP and YMCA partnership, expresses support in the following comment: "Bolstering this generation's civic literacy, particularly concerning local and state government, is vital to maintaining and strengthening the foundation of our democracy."
